

Who's afraid of yellow and gold? Anita Oppedijk, February 1996.

Formation 4C longways set, 3rd and 4th couples on opposite side.

Steps Scottish.

Music 32 bar Jig, Dovecote Park

1 – 8 2C & 3C ladies' chain.

9 – 12 2C & 3C left hands across

13 – 16 2C & 3C right hands across finishing in promenade hold (2C facing up and 3C down).

17 – 20 1L, 2C, 3C and 4L ½ a R-shoulder reel of four (2C and 3C pass left shoulder)

21 – 24 1M, 2C, 3C and 4M ½ a R-shoulder reel of four (2C face 3C in the centre).

25 – 28 2C & 3C set and half right hands across

29 – 32 2C arching, dance to top place, while 3C dance to the bottom (bar 31 – 32: 4C and 1C step to the centre)[2413].

Repeat 3 more times.

This dance was made with the help of The Rowan Tree Dancers for the Golden Jubilee of the N.V.S. (Dutch Dance Organisation for English and related dances). The colour of its magazine is yellow.
